Monthly Meeting

Our quarterly volunteer meeting was held at the Airport Administration building (the Old Commuter Terminal). We had several informative speakers. Nyle Marmion from Concessions, who is working on the Rental Car Center, announced that it will be opening on January 20, 2016. There will be a neighborhood event to which volunteers will be invited, and you will be able to view the new center. Watch for that invitation via email.

Two gentlemen working with the "Good Travelers Program" spoke to us about this environmental initiative. The initiative is to support environmental programs by donating money to offset our carbon footprint for air travel. You can purchase a ticket for \$1

which offsets 500 miles of your trip. There will be pop-up booths in the airport where tickets can be purchased. Currently, ALL proceeds are going to the Arcata Community Forest and Big Smile Wind Farm in Idaho. The long term goal is to have many of the airport vendors offering this opportunity and other environmental organizations as recipients of the funds. The airports and concessions are not making money off of this. If you would be interested in helping with one of the pop up booths at the airport, you can contact Steve Statler at (503)709-1900. His company is Cause Based Solutions. Tony Brock from the TSA came and spoke about the TSA Cares program, and PreChek programs. Those going through the PreChek program are no longer randomly selected, you have to be a member of the program now. The Precheck will show up in the left hand corner of your boarding pass. If asked pies and gelatins cannot be carried on board the aircraft. So leave Grandma's favorite pumpkin pie at home! Suggestion to keep valuables in your carry-on, even wallets. That way they go through the xray, but aren't sitting out in a bowl for temptation. If a wallet is missing send the passenger back to the checkpoint as they are kept there. They have a separate custody procedure for lost valuables. There are information cards on the file cabinet outside Gina's office.

Airport Updates

Solar panel installation in **Terminal 2 West parking** lot should be finished the end of November. That should free up some of the parking congestion.

MTS Kiosks will be installed near our desks for passengers to get tickets, etc. No date is set yet.

SAN Airport Long Term
Parking lots will be giving \$5
vouchers to passengers leaving
their cars in the long term lots
over the holidays. Vouchers can
be used for purchases at Airport
Concessions.

Some business center needs such as faxes, email, etc. can be done at the Airspace Lounge post security, near the T2East checkpoint. Other possibilities are Travelex and the Sheraton Hotel across from the airport.

When there is an **Emergency** at the **Airport** such as the recent event "Active Shooter" that shut down the airport for several hours, please do not give

out numbers such as Operations number to the passengers. Please only call Ops once for information. Gina continually tried to find out what was happening to no avail. So in these situations, please send the passengers to their respective airlines. They would be the only ones that will know where their flights have been diverted to and if the passengers were going to be bused to San Diego. You can call Operations, but do it once. Colm said they would be better about getting information out to the volunteers.

Holiday Pizzas for the USO

- Ginna James will be collecting money from volunteers to provide pizzas for the service members traveling through the Airport over the Christmas Holiday. Last year, we collected over \$1400 to purchase pizzas. You can leave a check in Ginna's mail file, leave cash or checks with Gina. If you wish, Ginna will provide you with a donation letter. Just let her know at the

time of your donation. If you wish to help her out, the pizzas will probably be delivered around the 22, 23, and 24th depending on when Camp Pendleton drops off the Marines. Just let Gina know if you wish to help.

Remember that we are not to recommend a particular shuttle company. **Shuttles for Hire** are assigned by the dispatcher at the podium on the islands in the parking lots. Just send the passenger requiring a shuttle to the dispatcher. Do not say Super shuttle or any company by name. If you have any questions, please ask Gina.

Do not give out the various **Airline telephone numbers** to anyone. The only numbers we are permitted to share are the 800 numbers or Lost Baggage numbers. The rest of the numbers for instance Airline Operations or General Managers, are for our use in emergency situations only.

Wounded Warriors Program

Thanks so much to Ginna James, Judy Bentovim, Tracey Schmidt for assisting the Severely Injured Military, who have recently traveled through San Diego. Your assistance is very much appreciated by all.

We are looking for volunteers to assist

with Wounded Warriors. It can mean some early mornings and late nights, but so needed. It works best if you are able to do the departure and arrival or vice versa. It is particularly helpful when PTSD or TBI injuries are involved. They will know who their escort is. We will be doing a short

orientation on Friday, October 2. at 10:00am, in the VAA Conference room outside Gina's office. Ginna will explain how the program works and what the volunteers do while they are escorting the Wounded Warriors. Come check out the program.

Ready, Pet, Go! Therapy Dog Program

We are so happy to welcome new Therapy Dog teams to the SAN Airport. They are Tony Carchedi/ **Janelle Kaneshiro** and Pekingese, Freddie; Jill Kaneshiro and Shih Tzu, Suri; Debbie Geyer and Black Labrador Retriever, Lulu; Carly Grimm and Golden Retriever, Atticus; Sharon La Spada and Vizsla, Harley; Pat Rodriguez and Bullmastiff, Ben; Lisa Shellstrom and Goldendoodle, Buddy.

Just starting their paperwork with Alli-

ance of Therapy Dogs are Sharon La Spada with her Viszla, Harley, Jody Nayoski with her St. Bernard, Gracie and Sharon Sherer with her Shih Tzu, Dylan.

We pair a team up with a badged Volunteer Airport Ambassador, so they can answer airport directional questions and be a second pair of eyes. Volunteers watch for other service dogs, large crowds of people coming down the concourse, etc. and let the Team owner know as they are watching their dogs interact with the passengers. Most of the dogs can go for approximately two hours. If you haven't tried a shift, you should! It will definitely make you smile and it's an opportunity to spread some happiness and calm in the Airport.

The teams will be out in force during the busy holiday season, so please sign up for a shift! Also if you know of anyone with a Therapy Dog, tell them about our program.

Cargo Office • Section 2 • Yellow Pages - pg YP-6: The American Airlines cargo office has moved closer to Kurtz from the far end of the line of offices at 2719 Kurtz. That makes it slightly easier to find. Passengers picking up pets go north on Pacific Highway, turn left on Kurtz and then make an immediate left into cargo office parking lot. The AA cargo office (suite A) is the first office on the left in the line of offices.

Reminder: Pets traveling as cargo are picked up at the various cargo offices. Pets traveling as checked baggage (meaning their owners are on the plane with them) come out on the baggage carousels.

Hotels • Section 4: The alphabetical (pink) and by location (green) hotel pages have been completely revised. There are several new hotel and some hotels changed affiliations.

The Hampton Inn on Greenwood will become a Four Points by Sheraton on

December 10th. In the meantime the hotel's name is Rosecrans Hotel. The hotel plans to continue with shuttle services for their guests under the Four Points name.

A Hilton Gardens Inn - Old Town/Sea World opened up in the former Padre Trails Inn location.

The 2 new hotels along the Embarcadero, next to the Wyndham, are due to open in February. They will be the Marriott brands of Residence Inn and SpringHill Suites. According to their websites they will offer only valet parking at \$40 per day!

Further along Pacific Highway at Hawthorne are 2 more hotels opening probably around March since construction looks to be behind the above Marriott hotels. These hotels will be a Hilton Gardens and a Homewood Suites. The parking arrangement for these 2 hotels appears to be the same i.e. valet parking at \$40 per night!

By June 2016 the Declan Suites will

close down and become a Marriott Vacation Club timeshare resort.

Reminders:

Known Crewmembers Program: Information about the Known Crewmember Program's security access points can be found in the Yellow Pages on page YP-13. The location of these access point lines varies from checkpoint to checkpoint. There are several instances where the Known Crewmembers use the passenger exit lines. These special lines are only for pilots and flight attendants who participate in that program. Our SAN Ambassador red sterile badges cannot be used in those lines.

TSA PreCheck: The address and telephone number of the TSA Pre-Check Application Enrollment center is in Section 14, Security on page 14-D-3 (almost the last page in the binders). Section 14 is in the Supplemental Binder at the desks and is the last section of the International Arrivals binder.
