Wounded Warrior Assist Program

What's New in the Blue? blue notebook that

CBX Shuttle • Handout packet and Area Airports pg 9-A-9: There is a new shuttle service to the Cross Border Xpress! The CBX shuttle leaves from the Santa Fe Depot every 2 hours starting at 5:30 am. The last shuttle is at 11:30 pm. Currently the fare is \$8 per person. The CBX shuttle picks up passengers on Kettner Blvd. in the white passenger-loading zone. There is a CBX signboard on the sidewalk showing passengers where to wait. Since this service is brand new, the current hours and fares may change.

The CBX shuttle that leaves the TJ airport to return to San Diego will drop passengers at SDIA as well as the RCC in addition to the Santa Fe Depot.

A CBX handout packet was added to the desks and the International Arrivals podium. It is the same size as the TI Directions packet and has a lavender cover. This is a draft packet and will be tweaked as your comments/suggestions are received. As with the other handout packets, please pull a sheet off the back of the packet. Please DO NOT pull off a sheet by reaching under the cover since that ends up ripping the cover.

Connecting to Free Wi-Fi at SDIA • Laminated packet: Instructions for connecting with the airport's free Wi-Fi have been added to the laminated packet. The information on this sheet is the same that has been in the Yellow Pages on page YP-12, but graphics have been added to help the passengers.

The major problem causing access problems is the need to trigger the Boingo Hotspot. When passengers see the signal bars they assume they are connected. Instead the bars only indicate that the device detects the Wi-Fi signal. The device needs to actually connect through the Boingo Hotspot. The passenger must go into the device's browser and attempt to connect

to any public website in order to trigger the hotspot. The hotspot ads, videos and other choices on the Boingo Hotspot screens change all the time. The passenger has to work through the prompts until the final "You are connected" screen.

Concessions • Laminated packets and SD Airport pgs 3-E: The Sharper Image store in T-2-E has closed. Mindworks, a toy store, has opened in its place.

Where can I get ...? • Laminated packet: The listing for SIM cards is being updated. Several of the vendors who had stocked SIM cards no longer have them. As of March 26th, SIM cards are only available, pre-security, at SANd-News in the T-2 baggage claim area and the CNBC Express newsstand in the T-2-E ticketing. Both of these units sell separate voice SIM cards and data SIM cards. Travelex has SIM cards but they evidently only fit in the Samsung Galaxy S5 phone.
