CBX Shuttle • Handout packet and Area Airports • pg 9-A-9: Tickets for the CBX Shuttle are sold by *Five Star Tours* inside their office in the Santa Fe Depot. To accommodate passengers with shuttle departures before or after office hours the shuttle driver will open the office to sell tickets. For these afterhours transactions the passenger must have the exact amount in dollars. The driver will not be able to make change nor accept credit cards.

Rental Cars • Section 5 Transportation • pg 5-D: Three new rent-a-car companies have been added. *Green Motion CA* is planning to open in the RCC June 15th. *Green Motion* was established in 2007 in England with the goal of offering low emission vehicles for hire. In 2011 they expanded to Mexico and subsequently to locations throughout Europe and the Middle East. While *Green Motion* has branches in Florida, this San Diego branch is the first one on the west coast. (By the way, there is still no word about *Sixt Rent-A-Car* opening in the RCC).

Horizon Rent-A-Car has been added to the list of off-site rental car companies.

At this point *Horizon* is a small company with no real Internet exposure so we will probably not have much call to work with them. *Horizon* is willing to work with passengers who are under 25 and those who might not have a credit card. *Horizon* is located at 1858 San Diego Avenue.

Economy Rent A Car has opened a location in the Laurel Parking Garage. Joy Car Rental has been at that location for a few years and recently became affiliated with Economy Rent a Car. Economy has headquarters in Costa Rica with locations in 32 countries. We do need to make sure that when a passenger asks for "Economy" they mean the rental company and not just the type of car rented.

Two new sections have been added to the orange <u>Rental Car</u> pages. Page 5-D-I now contains general information about the RCC – address, driving directions, lost & found procedures, etc. A new page 5-D-5 contains a list of near-by local edition offices for companies that are in the RCC. <u>Note</u>: Local Edition rental car locations are not the same as Off-Site Rental Car companies. Local editions are part of a rental car chain with an office in the RCC. Off-site rental car companies are not connected to the brands located in the RCC. Airport passengers renting from a local edition are subject to airport concession and facility fees. Passengers have to find their way to local edition locations. There are no airport or RCC pick-ups.

Coaster and Amtrak Schedules • Section 5 Transportation • pgs 5-P & 5-R: There are new Coaster and Amtrak schedules effective June 6th. This time there are major schedule changes for both Coaster and Amtrak. Any outdated Coaster schedules at the desks will no longer be very useful.

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Red Loop Courtesy Shuttle • Section 2 Yellow Pages • pg YP-19: A section with information about the <u>Red</u> <u>Loop Courtesy Shuttle</u> (aka *on-call shuttle* or *disability shuttle* or *Ace Parking Shuttle* or *disability shuttle* or *Ace Parking Shuttle* or *Terminal to Terminal Shuttle*) has been added. The shuttles pick up at the former Airport Loop bus stop (i.e. 992 & Employee Bus stops). The shortest wait time is 3 – 4 minutes. Wait times could be longer if a vehicle is not immediately available. The shuttle contact number is in this <u>Yellow Pages</u> section and also in the telephone lists in Section 1.
