Airport Updates

Title VI posters have been placed in our blue books as an FAA directive. Be advised, by reading the following directive:

Unlawful Discrimination It is unlawful for airport operators and their lessees, tenants, concessionaires and contractors to discriminate against any person because of race, color, national origin, sex, creed,

or disability in public services and employment opportunities. Allegations of discrimination should be promptly reported to the Airport Manager or: Federal Aviation Administration Office of Civil Rights, ACR-1 800 Independence Avenue,

MTS kiosks are located at the Terminal I and Terminal 2 information desks. Compass passes can be obtained at the kiosks. No one way tickets are available from the kiosks. Note that, when using the new credit cards with the chip on it, don't swipe the card. Insert the card, and when the light comes on then the card can be removed.

There are also only three (3) bus stops for the **992** in the Airport. One stop in Terminal I and two (2) stops in Terminal 2.

Air Canada has moved its operations to Terminal 2 West next to Hawaiian. They will be using Gate 41 and Carousel 3 for their baggage carousel.

TSA PreChek enrollment center is now located near the American Airlines ticket counter in Terminal 2 East. You may apply for PreChek there.

Rental Car Center is up and running and has ironed out most of the kinks, so we will not be having an Ambassador Podium at the Center. Please note the changes to the RCC bus pick up and drop off in Terminal 2. They have switched lanes. All rental car passengers take the bus to the RCC. Those with companies not located at the RCC will have to call their rental car company and have their shuttle come for pick-up. The stop for those shuttles is to the left of where the RCC bus drop off passengers.

Midway Car Rental is also known as MCar. MCar is located at the Rental Car Center and Midway is offsite and you must call for the shuttle.

Tickets & Tours
