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Volunteer in the Spotlight

Airport Updates


August and September Sterile Badge holders will need to renew their badges before the end of their birth month. You can renew the month before your birthday, but it must be completed by the end of your birth month. You need to make an appointment through Gina (recommended) or take your chances going standby. You will need a completed Fingerprint Application and Security Threat Assessment (STA) form and two forms of ID (a current passport, social security card, or birth certificate, and driver's license). All forms have to be filled out online, and then printed. No hand written forms are accepted. Gina can send you the links to the forms you will need. There is also a computer and printer outside Gina's office, which you can use to fill out forms and print them. The forms are on the desktop. Code for the door is 4266#.

There are also **two additional forms** that are needed should your fingerprints not go through the first time. You will need the Access Investigation form and the 10-year history form. It is suggested that while you have your documents out to fill out forms online you should just go ahead and fill out these additional forms.

Do not leave requests for supplies on Notes to Nancy. Call Gina. Most-used supplies are available in Adrianna's office on top of the refrigerator. The code to her door is 4952#. So if we aren't there you can still get supplies. The outside door is 4266#. With those codes you have access to drinks and supplies when the Ambassador office is closed.

Frontier Airlines will start non-stop service to San Antonio, Texas in October. Then in 2018 they will have non-stop service to Tulsa, Oklahoma. The new Carousel 3 can be used by multiple carriers. Common Use Podiums (2) will be installed in the area, so whatever Airline is using the carousel can have their baggage personnel there to assist passengers with bag issues. The new Carousel 3 could be used by two flights if needed. Both Hawaiian and Delta wide body flights will be using Carousel 3. Hopefully the flight numbers will be displayed on the Carousels. Fingers crossed!

Wounded Warrior escorts are needed. If you have a Sterile Badge and are interested in assisting with the Wounded Warrior program, please let Gina know. We have lost our previous escorts. You can be set up with one of the current escorts to see how to work with Wounded Warriors.



Santa Fe Station

be included in the Airport functions or meetings. Only the volunteers who also work for the airport will be included.

Tickets & Tours

To obtain **Old Town Trolley** and **Seal Tour** passage, you must contact Gina at least 72 hours in advance with the date (two dates for Seal Tour) you wish to go. Your request will be submitted and they will try to accommodate your request. If you have already used your guest passes for the Old Town Trolley, you can download a "Hometown

Pass" from their website and can accompany any paying passenger for free. Kindly note, this is not available on weekends. There are no tickets; your name is listed on the passenger manifest. No Seal Tours on weekends and no OTT on Holiday weekends.

Maritime Museum entrance privileges can be ob-

tained by contacting Gina at least 72 hours in advance by email at gina @travelersaidsandiego.org.

Midway Museum will give you a museum pass by showing your Travelers Aid nametag or Airport badge when you go to their ticket window. You will have to purchase tickets for those accompanying you.

What's New in the Blue . . . by Nancy Stockton

Greyhound - Sample Bus Schedules and Fares • Section 5 - Transportation • pg. 5-M: Greyhound departure times have been updated. A "walk up" fare is listed, but should be considered as a sample fare only. Greyhound has adopted a flexible fare system. In addition to discounts for reserving ahead of time, walk up fares listed on their web site vary for departure to each destination. The listed fare is the highest listed for that destination on a sample day.

Baggage Storage • Section 2 - Yellow Pages • pg. YP-5: Five Star Tours & Charter Bus Company is offering a luggage storage service. Five Star Tours has an office in the Santa Fe Depot on Kettner Blvd. They are charging \$7 for one bag, \$12 for 2 bags and \$20 for 3 bags. They are open Monday to Friday 8 a.m. to 8 p.m., Saturdays from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. and Sundays 8 a.m. to 2 p.m. They will accept all major credit cards or cash. The Yellow Pages listing will include a number to

call to verify that they are, indeed, open and to confirm details.

MTS Information • Section 5 - Transportation • pg. 5-O -3: Information about Compass Cloud and Compass Cash options has been added to the binders. The Compass Cloud app allows for purchase of oneday Regional Day Passes for \$5 or RegionPlus Day passes for \$12 as well as monthly adult passes. If the passenger is having trouble with the app accepting a credit card, the app should be deleted and reinstalled. If the passenger purchases multiple passes, these passes will show up under the My Ticket option on the app. When boarding a bus the passenger will have to show each pass to the driver. When using the trolley, passengers will have to show each pass to the Transit Offices when requested. There is no need to tap the validator.

Numbers for Airlines Serving SDIA • Section 4 – SD Airport • pg. 3-C-2: An additional baggage contact number has been added to the Condor listing. Airport Port Services (APS) is the contact for Condor, Edelweiss, and Sun Country. There is no central office for APS, however, hours when APS is on site and available have been added to the Condor heading on page 3-C-2 as well as the APS information on the Skycaps and Wheelchair section on page 3-D-2.

Shuttle • Section 5 - Transportation • pg. 5-J-I: Coronado Livery is no longer available at the San Diego Shuttle Association booth in the transportation islands. The San Diego Shuttle Association booth now works only with Advanced Shuttle, EZ Ride Shuttle and Sea Breeze Shuttle. Coronado Livery, as well as Prime Time Shuttle, might be seen picking up at curbside since their drivers have TCP licenses and are essentially operating as a charter. As such, their passengers must have prior reservations.
